

**Transcript of the Will of Margery Donne CRO AP/D/849**

In the Name of God Amen. The Seventeenth Day of August 1682  
I Margery Donne of the parish of St Earth in the County of  
Cornwall widow being at this p[re]sent in good health of body and  
of sound and perfect minde and memory (praised be God for the same)  
Doe make and declare this my last Will and Testament as followeth,  
First and principally and before all earthly things I commend my  
Soule into the hands of Almighty God my Creat[or] assuredly  
trusting and faithfully believing in and through the alone merits  
death and passion of Jesus Christ my only Saviour and Redeemer to  
have free remission of all my Sinnes and to inherit everlasting Life  
and be saved and by noe other meanes: My body I commit to the Earth  
from whence it came to be decently buried at the discretion of my Exec[utors]  
and for such worldly substance as God in mercy hath been pleased to  
bestow upon me I give and bequeath the same as followeth, ffirst  
I wish that all such debts as I shall justly and truly owe unto any  
person or persons shall be duly satisfied and paid. Item I give and  
bequeath unto John Dobbyn the summe of forty Shillings of good  
English money To be paid within Six months after my Decease:  
The rest and residue of all my Goods Chattles and personall Estate I  
Wholly give and bequeath the same unto my two Sons William Taubyn  
and John Donne whome I Doe hereby make and ordaine Joint Exec[utor]s  
of this my last Will and Testament, and I Doe hereby revoke all form[er]  
Wills and Testaments by me at any time made, and Doe will [and] ordaine  
That this only shall stand as my last Will and Testament and none  
Other. In witnesse whereof I the said Testatour to this my p[re]sent last  
Will and Testam[ent]have put my hand and Seale yeoven on the day [and] year  
First above written
